



Policy perspectives: Scheduled caste development in the Telangana paradigm

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Abstract

This paper examines the policies and programs implemented by the state government of Telangana, India aimed at the socio-economic development and welfare of Scheduled Castes (SCs). It analyzes the rationale, objectives, strategies, and outcomes of key initiatives undertaken since the formation of the state in 2014, particularly focused on education, livelihoods and employment, housing, budgetary allocations and more. The study evaluates the successes, gaps and challenges in translating policy commitments into ground-level impacts among the SC communities. It suggests policy perspectives and recommendations for more effective planning and delivery mechanisms to enable substantive developmental outcomes responding to the contextual needs and priorities of SCs.

The Scheduled Castes (SC) population in Telangana constitutes a significant portion of the state's demographic profile. According to the 2011 census, the total population of Scheduled Castes in Telangana was 1, 38, 78, 078 individuals, comprising 69, 13, 047 males and 69, 65, 031 females. These communities are predominantly concentrated in rural areas.

The average population of SCs in the state stands at 17.53%, with at least nine out of 33 districts having more than 20% SC population. Mancherla district has the highest Dalit population of 25.64%, while Hyderabad has the lowest percentage of Dalit population at 11.71%.

The SC population is distributed across various districts, and the two predominant castes, Madiga and Mala, account for a significant portion of the SC population in the state.

The demographic composition of the SC population in Telangana reflects a substantial presence in the state, with variations in population distribution and regional concentrations. These demographic insights are essential for understanding the social, economic, and educational needs of the SC communities and for formulating targeted development policies and programs.

The state of Telangana has been actively promoting economic development through various innovative policies and initiatives. The government has focused on the growth of the industrial sector, leading to increased investments and a conducive environment for businesses.
